

In case of COVID-19 exposure

If a staff or student feels ill separate that individual. Identify isolation rooms for students with symptoms of COVID-19

Infection/exposure control plan

Notify a nurse. DO NOT send the ill individual to the nurse's office without notification

Maintain at least 6 ft. apart

Teacher or aide will have the ill individual sitting down with minimal contact with non-exposed students. Have a isolation area.

Nurse will go pick up the ill individual, make a assessment of possible COVID-19, and then escort student to the office

Nurse will contact parent, administrator, and public health authorities about a suspected case

Janitorial staff will secure the area making it safe after students are dismissed

Once secured, it is recommended that the area is not disturbed for 24 hours to allow virus to settle before cleaning and disinfection can begin

Contaminated areas will be closed for at least 14 days to permit disinfection. Contaminated areas may be: classrooms, hallways, or entire school depending on the range of mobility of the ill individual

Any student or staff that had contact with the suspected case will need to be sent home for monitoring for symptoms

Securing area of exposure

Air exchange

When securing an area, it is recommended that a door or window be open to promote good air exchange

Fans and exhaust systems could be used to circulate the air if security risks are a concern
